

UNOFFICIAL TRANSLATION

The Regulation of the Election Commission

On

**Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Any Other Actions by Political Parties, Candidates and Voters (Number 2)
B.E. 2550**

As it is appropriate to amend the Regulation of the Election Commission on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters B.E. 2550,

By the authority provided in Section 236(1) of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand, Section 5 and Section 10(2) (3) and (5) of the Organic Act on the Election Commission B.E. 2550, Section 59 paragraph two of the Organic Act on the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and the Installation of Senators in association with the Resolution No 91/2550 of the Election Commission agreed upon on 30 October B.E. 2550, the Election Commission, therefore, promulgated the Regulation on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters as follows.

Rule 1 - This regulation is called ‘the Regulation of the Election Commission on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters (Number 2) B.E. 2550.’

Rule 2 - This regulation shall come into force as from the day of its publication in the Government Gazette.

Rule 3 - The meaning of ‘political party’ prescribed in Rule 3 of the Regulation of the Election Commission on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters B.E. 2550 shall be replaced by the following:

‘political party’ means a political party which nominates candidate for the election.

Rule 4 - Part (2) of Rule 4 of the Regulation of the Election Commission on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters B.E. 2550 shall be replaced by the following:

‘(2) using vehicles in the election campaigns or organising a place or a stage for campaigning apart from those provided in

accordance with the provision in Rule 11 of the Announcement of the Election Commission on the Criteria Governing the Operations of the State to Support the Election of Members of the House of Representatives B.E. 2550.’

Rule 5 - Part (4) of Rule 6 of the Regulation of the Election Commission on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters B.E. 2550 shall be replaced by the following:

‘(4) treating or promising to treat any person.’

Rule 6 - Rule 7 of the Regulation of the Election Commission on Election Campaigns, Practices and Prohibitions Relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives and Activities of Political Parties, Candidates and Voters B.E. 2550 shall be replaced by the following:

‘**Rule 7** In an election campaign, candidates, political parties, or voters, as the case may be, are prohibited from distributing or having any person distributing documents relating to an election by means of placing or dispersal.’
